C Walk Allight at Clapham Return from Giggleswick

12 miles Moderate

From Clapham station by lane to Clapham Village. Attractive field paths to Austwick (Stop for lunch - refreshments at Game Cock Inn) Feizor, Little Stainforth Stainforth, Goat Scar Lane Langcliffe Scar, Clay pits Plantation, Settle (Tea) Beggars wife Bridge to Giggleswick

D Walk Allight at Gargrave Return from Skipton

10 miles Moderately Easy

From Gargrave by Eshton and Friars Head to climb Flasby Fell before descending by Old Park into Skipton Picnic Lunch. Tea at Skipton

E Walk Allight at Skipton Return from Skipton

8 miles Moderately Easy

By Old Park Brackenley Farm to Embay (Lunch Stop - Yorks Dales Rly) Eastby Heug Gill Eastby Gate Halton Height Black Hill Houghill Nook, Moor Lane Halton East Eastby Embay. Bus to Skipton (Fare extra) as an alternative you may walk back to Skipton Tea in Skipton

For people who haven't been before, these are just like the ordinary Rail Rambler excursions except that instead of special trains we use scheduled services. Also we have only three guided walks, one of which - the easiest, usually includes a visit to a place of interest

Tickets may only be obtained at Blackpool (North) and Preston but you may use the tickets from Blackpool (N) Layton, Poulton le Fylde, Kirkham, Preston, Leyland and Chorley and also Bamber Bridge.

Whichever Rail Rambler you join it is the same fare rate £4.00 adult and £2.00 a child (5 and under 16 years)

So what do you do now

Decide where you wish to go

Buy your ticket(s)

Join the train(s) shown in this programme

Look out for Ramblers Association leaders who will be on the trains to advise you of the detailed travel arrangements and rambles on that particular day

Everybody is welcome to join the walks or rambles. Please wear strong shoes or boots and remember to bring a raincoat or another waterproof

Bring a drink and one or two packed meals.

Leaders will try to make sure that you can buy a drink at the end of the walk but this is not always possible

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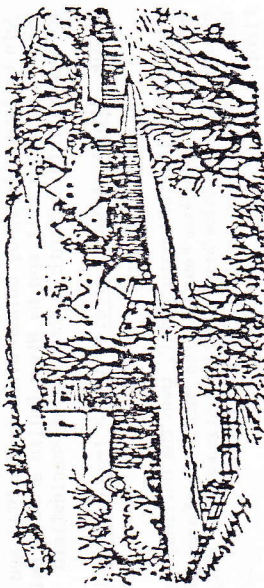

C Walk Alight at Congleton Return from Macclesfield
13 miles Moderate

From Congleton station by Macclesfield canal and Pool Bank to climb the Cloud. Descend by Bosley (Refreshment Stop at Golden Hall) to Bosley Reservoir. Ascend Wincle Minn and Join Gritstone Trail by Golden Slack Crover Hill and Foxbank Descend to Ridge Hall and by River Bollin and the Hollins to Macclesfield. Picnic Lunch. Tea at Macclesfield

D Walk Alight at Macclesfield Return from Macclesfield
10 miles Moderate

Through Macclesfield onto Canal, then the Hollins, Langley Hall Langley Tegg Nose Fear Ashtree Macclesfield Forest Wildboardclough, Shuttlinglow Wessit Hill Trentabank Resr Ridgegate Resr Langley, Birch Knoll to Macclesfield
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Macclesfield

E Walk Alight at Congleton Return from Macclesfield
9 miles Moderately Easy

From Congleton by Macclesfield Canal Key Green, Park Farm Crossley Hall Farm. Macclesfield Canal. Bosley aqueduct Bosley Locks to the Wheatshesf. Then to North Rode Jn and across the fields to North Rode. Through the Parkland to Rode Green continuing across the fields to Gawsorth. Look around the historic village. Bus to Macclesfield (Fare Extra) Picnic Lunch. Tea at Macclesfield

C Walk Alight at Sowerby Bridge Return from Hebden Bridge
12 miles Moderate

From Sowerby Bridge ascend via Moelard Town to Moelard Moor (933') Descend to Fringle and then climb passing Foot Hill to Crow Hill (1258') Continue to Crag Vale and by Cragg Brook to Hob Hole and thence to Hebden Bridge.
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Hebden Bridge

D Walk Alight at Sowerby Bridge Return from Hebden Bridge
10 miles Moderately Easy

From Sowerby Bridge along the Rochdale Canal to Luddenden Foot along the valley of the Luddenden Brook through Luddenden to climb onto Midgely Moor to reach Old Town before making the descent by Nut Clough to Hebden Bridge.
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Hebden Bridge

E Walk Alight at Mytholmroyd Return from Hebden Bridge
7 miles Easy

From Mytholmroyd station Hollins Hey Hollins Hey Wood Glen House, Cragg Vale, Old Cragg Hall, Swan Bank, Stoney Royd, Law Hill, Mitton, Milnshaw Farm, Errington Grange. Old Chamber, Hebden Bridge.
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Hebden Bridge

C Walk Alight at Whaley Bridge Return from Buxton
12 miles Moderate

From Whaley Bridge by Indebrook Reservoir to Taxal and Fernilee. Continue up the Goyt Valley passing Burnall Cob and then climb Berry Clough thus to Ladmanlow. Descend via Solomon's Temple and the Country Park into Buxton. Picnic Lunch. Tea at Buxton

D Walk Alight at Buxton Return from Buxton
10 miles Moderately Easy

From the station through Buxton to Ashwood Dale and by Staden Farm to Cowdale. Across the open fields to Kings Sterndale then descending to Wye Dale. By Cow Dale to climb above Wye Dale. Descend into Chee Dale and follow the River Wye through the Gorge to Millers Dale Bus to Buxton (Fare Extra) Time to lock round Buxton
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Buxton

E Walk Alight at Whaley Bridge Return from Buxton
9 miles Moderately Easy

From Whaley Bridge by Todd Brook reservoir to Taxal continuing by Fernilee towards the head of the Goyt Valley by Burnall Cob above the Enwood reservoir. Then by Long hill farm and Roman Road to Nithen End and through the Park into Buxton.
Picnic Lunch. Tea at Buxton
